Project Status:

Listed below are projected activities that have been completed to date.

- After reviewing the submitted documents and information, an on-site review was performed on 9/25/24 with Jeff Bryant, Superintendent, George Brooks, Director of Maintenance, and Tina Campbell of Greenbrier County Schools, along with Joyce VanGilder of the SBA Staff.
- On behalf of Greenbrier County Schools, a project budget and conceptual plan was established by The Thrasher Group.

Project Comments by the SBA Staff:

- White Sulphur Springs Elementary was constructed in 1967. The outdated facility presents critical safety, security and educational issues. Bus and parent drop-off/loading is not well defined and creates traffic issues along with safety concerns. The administration area is located away from the main entry, which allows access to the facility prior to checking into the main office. In addition, the Physical Education space is shared with the cafeteria and is partitioned by a curtain.
- The proposed project will address these concerns with renovations and an addition to the current facility. Renovations will include transforming the existing main entrance into a secure and well-defined space by constructing a new safe school entrance with a separate visitor entry. Updates to the existing HVAC system, doors, and windows will allow the county to operate more efficiently with significant cost savings. Roof and restroom upgrades address facility components that are nearing the end of their life expectancy. Bus and parent drop-off/loading zones will be reconfigured for better traffic control and provide safety for the students and staff. In addition, a new gymnasium will be constructed for improvement to the curriculum delivery and allow for an appropriate space for physical education learning.
