Harrison County requests up to \$5,313,402 in SBA funding for renovations at Robert C. Byrd Technical Center and Mountaineer Middle School. These funds will be used in partnership with a local contribution of \$2,000,000 for a total project cost of \$7,313,402.

Project Status:

Listed below are projected activities that have been completed to date.

- After reviewing the submitted documents and information, an on-site review was performed on 9/26/24 with Dora Stutler, Superintendent, Jimmy Lopez, Julie Mancini, and Jamie Looker of Harrison County Schools, along with Joyce VanGilder of the SBA Staff.
- On behalf of Harrison County Schools, a project budget and conceptual plan was established by McKinley Architects and Engineers.

Project Comments by the SBA Staff:

- Harrison County is working to complete its extensive merger and consolidation of schools. This multi-school merger consists of moving Liberty High School students to Robert C. Byrd High School, consolidating Mountaineer and Washington Middle into the current Liberty High School. Mountaineer Middle will become an elementary school that will receive the students from the closure of North View Elementary.
- Harrison County proposes to expand the Robert C. Byrd High School cafeteria to accommodate the additional students from the closure of Liberty High School. Furthermore, this project proposes to renovate and construct an addition to the existing Career and Technical learning spaces for the expansion of the ProStart (culinary), agriculture and aviation mechanics programs.
- In addition, this project proposes renovations to the current Mountaineer Middle School with new restrooms in existing classrooms that will house the incoming Pre-K and Kindergarten students as it transitions into an elementary school. A new student drop-off/pick-up area will be included in this project.
