### **Project Status:**

Listed below are projected activities that have been completed to date.

- After reviewing the submitted documents and information, an on-site review was performed on 10/17/24 with Keri Lambert and Dustin Cogar of Lewis County Schools, along with Mark Miller of the SBA Staff.
- On behalf of Lewis County Schools, a project budget and conceptual plan was established by Williamson Shriver Architects.

### **Project Comments by the SBA Staff:**

- Lewis County High School was built in 1994 with SBA funds. The bricks along the outside of the building lack proper sealing and have begun to deteriorate, allowing water infiltration and the potential accumulation of mold. The windows are original to the building, inefficient, and have collected moisture in some areas. Several areas throughout the building are showing age and decline, most notably in paint, interior doors, flooring, plumbing and bathroom fixtures.
- Lewis County proposes to implement exterior and interior renovations to rejuvenate and modernize Lewis County High School. This would include cleaning and sealing the exterior brick, tuck pointing masonry cracks, replacement of doors and windows, a general building repaint, a comprehensive upgrade to communications systems, restoration of restrooms, and other repairs. The project would also incorporate the addition of an exterior canopy to connect the two front entrances, creating a covered area for students to gather during bus loading and unloading.
