Morgan County requests up to \$4,291,384 in SBA funding for HVAC replacement at Widmyer Elementary School and Berkeley Springs High School. These funds will be used in partnership with a local contribution of \$400,000 for a total project cost of \$4,691,384.

Project Status:

Listed below are projected activities that have been completed to date.

- After reviewing the submitted documents and information, an on-site review was performed on 10/18/23 with Kristen Tuttle, Superintendent, and Jeremy Duelley, Facility Director of Morgan County Schools with Ken Hughart, WVDE Office of School Facilities, and Joyce VanGilder of the SBA Staff.
- On behalf of Morgan County Schools, a project budget and conceptual plan was established by Williamson and Shriver Architects.

Project Comments by the SBA Staff:

- At Berkeley Springs High School, one 20-ton Roof Top Unit (RTU) stopped cooling the cafeteria and the county had to order two 5-ton temporary units to pump air through the windows of the cafeteria. The existing RTU is still running for air ventilation but is not conditioning the space. This temporary solution is not adequate or efficient.
- Widmyer Elementary School has seven roof top units with a large amount of insulated ductwork
 extending across the roof to condition spaces. The system has reached the end of its life
 expectancy and replacement parts are becoming obsolete. The insulated weather proofing around
 the ductwork is separating and peeling.
- At Widmyer Elementary School, this project includes replacement of the rooftop units with an indoor air cleaning system. This project also proposes to reuse the existing ductwork and the new Variable Air Volume (VAV) boxes in the ceilings, which were installed within the last five years. New direct digital controls (DDC) and CO² controls will be included. New high-efficiency weatherproof insulation is proposed to cover the rooftop equipment and ducts.
