Project Status:

Listed below are projected activities that have been completed to date.

- After reviewing the submitted documents and information, an on-site review was performed on 10/10/24 with Mr. John Hudson, Superintendent, and Bruce McGrew, Assistant Superintendent of Putnam County Schools, along with Patrick Elliott of the SBA Staff.
- On behalf of Putnam County Schools, a project budget and conceptual plan was established by ZMM Architects and Engineers.

Project Comments by the SBA Staff:

- The current site/facility poses a safety risk to students as it is fronted by WV Route 34. Each day the principal and SRO direct traffic, helping students cross the road when they are dropped off/picked up by parents. There is no escape route from the property in the back of the school as it is completely fenced in. There are multiple entrances/exits when going from one end of the facility to the other causing the students to exit the building twice. Staff parking is also inadequate.
- The building was constructed in 1950 and is insufficient for educational programming as classrooms are inadequate for up-to-date STEM curriculum. The current facility is not ADA compliant as it is two-stories but has no elevator. The eighth-grade students have classes on both floors.
- The HVAC system in inadequate as rooms have PTAC units. Many of the units' controls are "rigged" to operate. Kitchen staff report that their AC units break down regularly.
- The kitchen does not have enough space for the required coolers, refrigerators and freezers. Due to their ages, there are constant breakdowns of the ovens, warming cabinets and milk cooler.
- The sewage system is outdated and in constant need of repair. The pipes are terra cotta clay and frequently clog/back-up. Raw sewage smells infiltrate the building. The maintenance crew reportedly spends much time/money on repairs. The EPDM roof leaks in several areas throughout the building.
- Putnam County has proposed a \$50 million county-wide capital improvement bond which will
 provide funding to construct a state-of-the-art middle school. This new facility will offer a
 diverse and innovative curriculum, advanced technology systems, flexible learning spaces, and
 improved safety measures.
- A 25-acre site adjacent to Hurricane High School has been selected for the new school building.
